

Galvone: 33rd out of 40 towns/ cities surveyed. Moderately Littered.

It is heartening to see Galvone continue to improve. There are just two sites which have been persistently poorly performing over a long number of years – Galvone Industrial Estate and the Bring Facility at Roxboro Shopping Centre. The latter is in sharp contrast to the actual shopping centre in which it is located, it was excellent. Crossagalla Industrial Estate and Kennedy Park were also very much deserving of the top litter grade.

Childer's Road: Grade B+. (from Parkway Roundabout to Kilmallock Roundabout). This was one of a couple of sites in Galvone which just missed the top litter grade. The overall impression was quite positive, but it was let down by some food related litter, along with alcohol cans, particularly at the 'Municipal Weighbridge' area.

Bawnmore Road: Grade B. (at Rathbane). There were heavy levels of plastic bottles, sweet papers and mineral cans, along with lower levels of face-masks, coffee cups and fast-food wrappers along this road. It was most noticeable on the road as one comes to the Kilmallock Road and on the kerbs at the car park for Bawnmore Cemetery.

O'Malley Park: Grade B. The grasslands within this large residential area were good with regard to litter. Much of the area presented well, however there was still a definite litter presence, particularly close to the entrance from Bawnmore.

Galvone Industrial Estate: Grade D. There has been no change to the litter / dumping issue to the rear of Galvone Industrial Estate. The remainder of the area was fine.

Bring Centre at Roxboro Shopping Centre: Grade D+. On first impression, this looked like a moderately littered site. Further exploration revealed significant dumping to the rear of the units, particularly at the base of the shrubbery. As well as cardboard boxes / plastic bags, items of household furniture had been discarded.

Roxboro Shopping Centre: Grade A. This is usually a very good site with regard to litter – things were no different this time around. It was a template for a Grade A site.

Bawnmore Road: Grade B+ (at Kennedy Park). Alcohol cans, mineral cans and sweet papers took away from an otherwise good site. With a little extra effort this could be a top-ranking site.

Kennedy Park: Grade A. The overall impression created at this site was a very good one. Grasslands were well attended and there was a complete absence of litter throughout.

Galvone Road: Grade A. (at Kennedy Park) The pavements / kerbs / roads were very good with regard to litter. The overall impression was a tidy one.

Crossagalla Industrial Park: Grade A. The main roadway through the business park was very clean. Almost all the premises presented very well. Apart from some industrial plastic wrapping there were no other visible litter issues of note.
