An Taisce Report – IBAL Anti-Litter League, Survey 2, 2022

Monaghan: 8<sup>th</sup> out of 40 towns / cities surveyed. Cleaner than European Norms.

A very strong performance by Monaghan with the absence of seriously littered sites having a big impact on the overall ranking. The Diamond Shopping Centre has regularly been a seriously littered site – not so this time around, just a moderately littered one. All the approach roads were very good with regard to litter and other examples of top ranking sites included North Road and Monument to Col Vesey Dawson.

**N54 Approach: Grade A.** This road was characterised by good road surface / markings / signage and attractive tree planting. The area to the front of Kingspan was particularly freshly presented. There were no litter issues of note.

**Monaghan Hospital: Grade B+.** The hospital grounds were well presented and maintained with attractive planting throughout. If it wasn't for the blue builders' plastic and some food related items (sweet papers, fast-food wrappers, plastic bags and coffee cups) at the grassy bank, this would have been a top-ranking site.

**The Diamond Shopping Centre: Grade B.** There was some improvement noted at this site, but that is coming from a low base. This time around it was moderately littered with fast-food wrappers, sweet papers, cigarette butts and alcohol cans being the most obvious items. The overall impression was of an area which lacked a thorough cleaning in quite some time and one where a very careless attitude to littering prevails – it could easily slide back to heavily littered status.

**Monument to Col Vesey Dawson: Grade A.** The monument and the immediate environs were freshly presented with attractive paving, large planer boxes, seating and bollards – all were in very good condition. There was a complete absence of litter.

**North Road: Grade A.** An attractively presented shopping street with lovely brick work, planter boxes, hanging baskets etc. The long wall mural with children's art is a great way to take away the bare look of a vacant site, while at the same time, giving the children an opportunity to display their artwork. The overall impression along North Road was a very good one.

**Recycle Bank:** Grade B+. A freshly presented facility with five bottle / can units and one 'Clothes Pod' – units and signage associated with same were in good order. On first impressions it seemed like this as a very clean site, further exploration revealed some items stuffed between / behind the units. A more thorough approach to not just emptying but cleaning is required.

**N54 Cavan Approach Road: Grade A.** This route was very much deserving of the top litter grade. Colourful planting at the Margaret Skinnider Roundabout created a welcoming impression. A boarded up two storey building had been brightly painted to great effect, taking away the bare look.

**St. Louis Secondary School: Grade A.** All appeared in very good order with buildings and grounds well-presented and maintained.

**Milltown Approach Road: Grade A.** Apart from some noticeable graffiti on a wall, this approach was virtually litter free.

**Monaghan Library: Grade A.** There were no litter issues at this facility. Weeds were beginning to develop at the front but not to any great degree.
