Limerick City South - Galvone: 34th out of 40 towns / cities surveyed. Littered.

Two litter blackspots saw Galvone lose its 'moderately littered' status of one year ago. Top ranking sites included Roxboro Shopping Centre and Crossagalla Business Park – both were well presented and maintained. This is in sharp contrast to the Recycle Facility within Roxboro Shopping Centre which has been a poorly ranking site over previous IBAL Surveys. The other poorly ranked site in Galvone was the miscellaneous site and area adjacent to Treaty Steel at Galvone Industrial Estate – significant dumping is an issue at this site.

Roxboro Shopping Centre: Grade A. This site is typically a top ranking one – things were no different this time around. Car parking area / pavements to the front of the shops were in good condition. (See separate survey site area for the Recycle Facility)

Recycle Facility, Roxboro Shopping Centre: Grade D+. Similarly, this site has regularly been a heavily littered one and there was little change to this status this time around. The area to the front of the units was fine – the areas to the rear / side tell a different story. Huge numbers of black sacks of rubbish had been discarded to the rear of the units. This was dumping on a monumental scale.

Crossagalla Business Park: Grade A. This business / industrial area was deserving of the top litter grade with a virtual absence of litter. There was still some industrial plastic / wrapping but the overall impression generally fine.

Ballysimon Road: Grade A. Overall, this road was deserving of the top litter grade despite some litter at the entrance to one particular site and minor litter near the Childers Road junction.

Roxboro Road: Grade B+. Road surface / markings / signage were in good order. Recent, food related items (e.g. coffee cups, plastic bottles, fast-food wrappers and sweet papers) took away from an otherwise well-presented environment. It was most obvious adjacent to the houses at approach to the railway bridge. A more thorough approach to cleaning could address this.

Kennedy Park: Grade B+. A hard-hitting dog fouling sign reminds the public that the dog fouling fine could be a maximum of \notin 4,000.00. Large and very colourful planter boxes have been installed along the pathway but unfortunately, they have become a sort of bin receptacle in the absence of any other bins in the immediate area. With a little extra effort, this could easily be a top-ranking site.

Galvone Industrial Estate: Grade B. An improvement of previous surveys with casually discarded food related items being the only issue this time around. See separate survey site below within the industrial estate.

Miscellaneous site and area adjacent to Treaty Steel at Galvone Industrial Estate: Grade D. This wasn't just a littered site but one subject to severe dumping. While it would seem that some previous issues have been tackled, new issues have arisen.

Galvone Road at Kennedy Park: Grade B. The overall impression at this residential area was of a litter presence. Items were all food related and casually discarded. Signage indicating the fine for illegal dumping of rubbish indicates that it is \notin 4,000.00.

Weigh Station on Childers Road: Grade C. There was a mix of recent and long-lie litter at this site. It presents poorly and this is only likely to deteriorate further if not addressed. Graffiti was unsightly.
