Portlaoise: Clean to European Norms. 19th out of 40 towns / cities surveyed.

A consistent performance by Portlaoise, let down by a couple of heavily littered sites. Top ranking sites included the approach routes, commercial area of Highfield / Maryborough, Bring Facility at Council Offices and Portlaoise Train Station (Exterior) – formerly somewhat littered but very much deserving of the top litter grade this time around. Carmody Way / Fair Green was subject to some isolated dumping and needs attention to prevent further deterioration. There was very little improvement at Mountain Ash Square / Common Land – it's still being subject to neglect and abuse.

Kilkenny Approach Road: Grade A. A freshly presented route with paving, bicycle path, road surface etc. in good order, creating a positive first impression of Portlaoise. Hedges were trimmed and impression was of a well maintained environment.

Carmody Way / Fair Green: Grade C. The overall impression at this site wasn't just casually littered but dumped upon e.g. mixed bags of rubbish, abandoned child's toy, something that looked like the frame of a trampoline and other miscellaneous items. It would seem that these items didn't just build up overnight – where does responsibility for this site lie?

Highfield / Maryborough Retail: Grade A. A freshly presented retail environment with paving, bollards, litter bins and colourful tree planting. The whole area presented well and was very much deserving of the top litter grade.

N80 Mountmellick Approach Road: Grade A. There were no obvious litter issues along this route, some of which passes through residential housing. All appeared in good order.

Shuttered / Metal Grilled House, Harpur's Lane: Grade A. Clearly a careful eye is kept on this site as there was no litter directly associated with it, despite the very low fencing, making it an easy target.

Main Street: Grade A. Clearly a careful eye is kept on the various closed down / vacant premises as there was no litter directly associated with them. Paving, bollards, and planter boxes were lovely features. The overall impression was a positive one with regards to litter.

Derelict Premises - 44 Main Street: Grade A. Identifying signage indicates that the former business was 'founded in 1955'. While this premises presents poorly, it wasn't a littered one.

Portlaoise Train Station – Exterior: Grade A. In previous IBAL Surveys this site has, from time to time, been littered. Not so, this time around. Well done to the users and station staff.

Portlaoise Train Station – Interior: Grade A. There were minimal litter items at this small waiting room environment.

Jessop Retail Square: Grade A. This small, town centre shopping area was very much deserving of the top litter grade.

Mountain Ash Square / Common Land: Grade C. This site appears to be in two parts with one open to the public and the second area with a condemned building project. Both were littered, not just small items but larger items e.g. child's buggy and other miscellaneous items.

Recycle Facility at Council Offices: Grade A. A small 'on-street' facility which was very much deserving of the top litter grade. Is it because the facility is beside the council offices that the public are less likely to abuse it?
